Steps in Faith . . . Where Are We?

Greetings in Christ! For this month's article, I answer a few important questions that I frequently entertain from congregation members. It is good to be your interim pastor!

Where are we in the process of calling a new Senior Pastor?

The Pastor Nominating Committee continues their work toward eventually nominating a new Senior Pastor candidate to lead the congregation and staff. In the Presbyterian Church, once this person is identified, the candidate will lead worship and preach at a service of the congregation. Following the service, the congregation will then vote on the question of calling the candidate as the installed senior pastor. The Pastor Nominating Committee recently wrote this update of their ministry together:

The PNC continues to search for a new Senior Pastor for St Andrew. We are excited to report we have reviewed over 70 applications, and have narrowed our search to 13 candidates. We are in the process of reviewing sermons of selected candidates, and will begin doing telephone interviews. Please continue to keep the committee and the candidates in your prayers as we continue the evaluation process.

Where are we with our 2010 financial resources for ministry?

In so many respects, we are tremendously blessed. In less than two years, the St. Andrew community has offered more than \$900,000 toward the Camp Cardinal 40 acres. In the same time period \$145,000 has been offered to debt reduction, bringing the unpaid mortgage balance down under \$100,000. The St. Andrew congregation has so many who are genuinely living into the spiritual practice of generosity. Thank you! Session also wants the congregation to know that our general ministries, mission, staff and programs

fund at the end of April was lagging \$33,000 behind. And so, as the church has for centuries, we look for a new generosity of the Spirit to accomplish Christ's on-going good work here in 2010. The Session invites you now in early summer to discover the freedom, the joy and the holiness of expressing your faith in Christ through acts of giving and trust.

Where are we in deciding our location for ministry?

Session discussed at last week's meeting if the St. Andrew community should begin new all-church talks this summer on the issues concerning our future location of ministry. The answer "not yet" became clear as we worked together. Instead, before the new Senior Pastor arrives sometime later this year, Session has decided to lay additional solid groundwork to prepare our community of faith before we return to these "hard" questions. This groundwork includes further enriching the sense that we live in holy covenants with one another, and that as a people of faith we are called to relate to others as the living, loving Christ teaches us to do.

And so in this time before a new Senior Pastor arrives, Session plans:

To create a new "Study Circle" opportunity for our congregation. This is a conversation method that Alban Consultant Susan Nienaber taught to 40 congregation members in her previous visit. The purpose of this new Study Circle event is five-fold:

- 1) To offer the trained congregational facilitators a second opportunity to lead fairly low-tension discussion groups and to refine their skills.
- 2) To make the larger congregation more aware that we have among us these specially trained facilitators.
- 3) To use the Study Circle format to build further fellowship and to encourage guided discussion sharing among individuals in the congregation.
- 4) To build a greater level of comfort in the congregation with this style of communication and with the Christian conversational boundaries that are a part of it.
- 5) And, to build an awareness that "Study Circles" will play an integral facet when St. Andrew returns to discussing its future ministry location.

Once the new Senior Pastor arrives, a Session decision will be made in conjunction with him or her on how to best utilize the trained facilitators – either to refine the vision of our ministry, or to engage in conversation about our future location for ministry, or perhaps another subject.

Also, the Session purchase agreement continues with Jeff Maxwell on the Melrose Avenue church property for \$4.3 million. Mr. Maxwell may be approaching the City of University Heights soon to seek to have our Melrose Avenue property rezoned to allow his proposed development. If Mr. Maxwell is successful in rezoning the church property, and all other contingencies in the contract are met, the congregation will take a vote on whether or not to sell the property to Mr. Maxwell. This congregational vote would need to occur sometime in the next 2 ½ years, before January 2013.

Session Minutes - April 15, 2010

Session **approved** the removal from the rolls of Kristen Eggers Mead to Cedar Hill Community Church in Cedar Rapids; Albert and Kathleen Fenoy to Christ the King Presbyterian Church in Houston, TX.

Heather and Randy highlighted the end of year activities and summer activities under their jurisdictions. Their biggest challenge is getting volunteers. Session was encouraged to talk to kids and parents to enhance faith development of the teens by coming to St. Andrew Youth programs.

Marilyn and Jack Rogers sent a letter to Session commenting on the Alban Institute report. Allan Mebus will send a letter on behalf of Session in response and make a personal contact.

A small group is scheduled to have a phone conversation with Susan Nienaber on April 20. Session would like her to return to our church May 14 - 16. Session would like her to train leaders of the church to be facilitators but had concerns how that could be done in one week-end visit. Susan indicated that St. Andrew needs a more concise identity. This would be one of the first jobs handled by a new pastor. No supplement from Session will be drafted at this time to enhance Susan's report.

Cheryl Johnson and Allan Mebus explained that Sunday's meeting at 5 pm will look at enhancing the worship service once in a while

with music changes. What exactly will happen will be more solid after Sunday's meeting. The structure of the service would not change.

Spring Clean-up at the church will be this Saturday from 9-noon.

The Consent Agenda was **approved**: \$2,550 to Camp Wyoming for purchase and installation of a new furnace in Hickory Lodge. \$1,200 to Christian Culture Community of Iowa City, for general programmatic needs \$1,000 to Hillcrest Family Services, Dubuque, to be used for ongoing development, recreational, and educational programs for at-risk and special needs youth.

\$1,200 to Mission Aviation Fellowship, in support for Larry and Linda Whiting.

Tabled and referred back to MOS was \$1,500 to Heritage Christian School, North Liberty, for science lab equipment for its new school.

Paul Heidger gave some background of support for UCM by the Presbyterian Church. Session shared a bit about how extensive the UCM discussions have been during the last months. Session also explained a little about how the percentages were changed for the St. Andrew monies to the larger church.

PNC reported that Committee on Ministry was informed regarding concerns with the search process. COM felt this not to be a problem. 60 applicants have applied for our Senior Pastor

position. They are looking at 10+ with interest.

Marilyn Holland reported that Bob and Emory David did a service at Ecumenical Towers recently that was well received.

Allan Mebus received a note from the mayor of University Heights thanking us for our thoughtfulness concerning their rezoning issues.

Nominating Team will meet between services on Sunday, April 18. Members of the team are: Mary Jo Abbott, David Drake, Denise Schimtz, David Grady, Patti Benson, and Mary Schmidt.

Senior Fellowship Luncheon on April 20.

Session Minutes – May 20, 2010

Pastor Bob opened the meeting with a meditation and prayer on the Pentecost story.

Session **approved** into membership of Dan and Connie Steele by letter of transfer from Forest Lake Presbyterian Church, Columbia, SC; and Susan Staggs Voss by letter of transfer.

Session **approved** the removal from the rolls of Brian Campbell, James Kelley and Michelle Kelley, Tamara Campbell Strecker, Chris Strecker and son Ethan Strecker.

The Clerk will respond to a congregation member's letter received by Session. The letter expressed concern that Session ended this year its financial support of United Campus Ministry and UCM director Nancy Olthoff. The member, a UCM board member, informed Session she will be re-directing a portion of her church pledge to support the United Campus Ministry. Session felt this appropriate if she directly made a check to UCM and reduced her pledge to St. Andrew by that amount.

Good feedback was received by Session from the weekend with Alban Consultant Susan Nienaber. Her Sunday School hour presentation on the "Landscape of American Religions" will be made available on the church webpage. Pastor Bob presented a plan for eventually using the "Study Circle" technique with the congregation to discuss St. Andrew's future ministry location. Session decided prior to the arrival of a new Senior Pastor, the facilitators trained by Susan Nienaber should be given more opportunities to lead *Study Circles* and hone their skills. Once the new Senior Pastor arrives, a Session decision can be made in conjunction with him or her on how to best utilize the trained facilitators – either to refine the vision of our ministry, or to engage in conversation about our future location for

ministry or perhaps another subject.

A Design Team of Alissa Villhauer, Allan Mebus, David Drake, Ellen Found, Clai Dungy and Pastor Bob – with assistance from Susan Nienaber – was approved to design topics and questions for the next step of *Study Circles* prior to the arrival of the new senior pastor. The Design Team will work to lay the groundwork for the future conversations St. Andrew will be having on "hard" questions.

Session addressed the income and expenses of the 2010 budget, with the Finance Team reporting the general fund being more than \$30,000 short in income at the end of April. Session **approved** to charge Stewardship Team with immediate action to take steps to increase giving. Session **approved** a target of a loss of no more than \$21K at end of July 2010. If this goal is not met, Session will consider further action. Messages concerning this will occur via sermon and also through church publications.

St. Andrew's style of worship and ways of doing worship were discussed. June 20 will be a Sunday of enhanced worship developed by a newly formed group and led by elders Cheryl Johnson and Al Mebus. Elder James Hemsley thanked all who plan and lead worship and encouraged elders and congregation members to join or speak with the Worship Team about any concerns or ideas about all our worship endeavors.

The Building Team reported that meetings with the Building Team and staff liaison Randy Hausler have been held with our cleaning service, EJS. New cleaning responsibilities have been added, the custodians will now work late night, two will be in the building rather than one, and a supervisor will be overseeing the custodians. Also, the Men's Group will be redoing the back area with earth moving and laying rock in order to sell more parking spaces during football games.

The Consent Agenda for May 20, 2010 was **approved**:

*\$2,200 for laundry equipment for the Salam Medical Center, Cairo, Egypt, a ministry led by Dr. Freddy Elbaiady who will be visiting St. Andrew this summer.

*\$300 for summer camperships as designated by Chaplain John Sellers at the State Training School for Boys, Eldora.

*\$500 for two boys to go to Stronghold/ Camp Wyoming or other Christ-centered summer camping experiences.

Personnel Team brought forth a motion to purchase Mac Laptop, Office software and i Works for Music Director Matthew costing \$1,355. This motion was **withdrawn**. A motion was made that as long as Personnel Team had \$2,000 as a line item in their budget for computers they could utilize the resources as they see fit, as long as they remain within budget. An amendment was added to the motion that the Personnel Team consider purchase of a PC rather than a Mac. The amendment was **approved**. The entire motion with the amendment was then **approved**.

A team of Kathi Anderson, Jackie Stokes and a member from the Nominating Team will take a look into the size of Session, the rationale for the local church to not offer consecutive terms to elders, and what are the expectations of elder leadership service during their term.

Session adjourned at 10:30 pm with prayer by Bob.

The next regular session meeting will be June 17, 2010.

Stewardship

Last month we observed Wills Emphasis Sunday. One last point before we leave this subject: Say I pass away without a will. This places my survivors (grown children, siblings, whoever they may be) in a difficult spot. All of a sudden they need to relate to one another on a different level, somehow blend reason and emotion, and try to reach decisions on "things" that hold memories, value, or both, in such a way that each person can leave that period of time without harsh words, without feeling either guilty or cheated, and, overall, without a negative residue that stains the relationships among them for years to come. That is hard to do! Add the fact that, without a will, the State will decide what happens with some of these assets. There is no other way to put it – to exe-

cute a valid will is to engage in an act that shows your love for your family.

On a separate point, your Stewardship Team will be seeking ways to foster increased giving for the rest of 2010. Year-to-date, we are behind our operating budget by about \$33,000. It's not the first time we've started this way, and there is some seasonality in our giving. Overall, we are moving in a very positive direction with the creation of equity in our land (land debt reduced from \$1,285,193 to \$614,943) and with our first mortgage on the church now down below \$100,000 (\$95,151). All good news. All heading the right way. We just need to find ways to cash flow our day-to-day needs. Our team will continue to focus on stewardship as a

ministry. Part of that ministry is raising up the need, so that all of us can feel the importance, and the meaning, in meeting this need.
