### Steps in Faith . . . Deepening Our Story

I want to bring to your attention that Alban Institute Consultant Susan Nienaber will be ministering among us once again the weekend of Friday, May 14 to Sunday, May 16. On this visit, the Session has decided for Susan's main focus to be the training of congregational volunteers in leadership skills. Those taking part will gain a stronger understanding in how to lead faith-based group dialogues, and how to use certain practices that encourage the respect of participants and regard of different viewpoints.

Susan says research shows it is important for congregations facing controversial decisions to "build greater leadership capacity" within the Body of Christ. The hope is that, through this training, the St. Andrew community will have a wider understanding of why Christians firmly claim a higher level of care in relationships and discussions than the win/lose culture we live in. A colleague of Susan's at the Alban Institute, Gil Rendle, writes, "We love our neighbor as we love ourselves. We forgive one another seven times seventy times, as Jesus said, because we understand, according to our faith, they are the right things to do . . . We do these things because they are a discipline of our faith. We are different than the culture around us."

The hope of this training is also that when we return to discussions about our future location for ministry and

other issues, we will have broadened faith-understandings and developed new skills that stand soundly upon our Biblical witness. The Psalmist sets before the faithful and us a soaring aspiration: "How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity."

And so, along with Session, I invite you to consider attending a training session led by Susan Nienaber. The same training class will be offered at various times on Friday afternoon/evening and during the day on Saturday. Look for these times and how to sign-up in upcoming weekly editions of the *Mini-Messenger* newsletter.

Then on Sunday, May 16, immediately following the 11:00 am service, Susan and the newly trained congregational facilitators will be leading an enjoyable "timeline" workshop for the congregation that explores our full 52-year church history. This workshop will uncover both the recent and distant stories that point to our church strengths and identity in Jesus Christ. It will be a fascinating time to discover together, and to hear from one another, how God has uniquely formed us as a body of Christ. The voices of our newest church members, to our original charter members, and to all in between are needed to compose this rich symphony of St. Andrew's story.

A lunch will be provided for all. Child-care will also be available.

Susan has remarked that a "timeline" event like this is a constructive way to prepare for the arrival of a new senior pastor. Through it, the church can grasp a higher level of awareness of its character and of its missional strengths. This knowledge helps lay a firm grounding, upon the arrival of a new senior pastor, for the development of a fresh new paired vision for ministry.

And so I invite you and encourage you to also consider attending this meal and timeline workshop on Sunday, May 16. Information concerning sign-ups will be communicated in upcoming *Mini-Messengers*.

*Missa Festiva* by John Leavitt was begun in 1988 with the commission of a festival piece for the International Choral Symposium in Kansas City, Missouri. The Festival Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) of this mass was the result of that commission. The other parts of the Ordinary followed, the Kyrie (Lord, Have

Mercy) + Agnus Dei (Lamb of God). The Gloria (Glory to God) was finished in the fall of 1990.

This work uses texts from the Ordinary, the parts of the Christian worship service that are used each week in many denominations. The Latin texts used, time honored through many centuries, are embraced for their richness and connection to the Universal Church - past, present, and future.

# Session Minutes - March 25, 2010

The Session of St. Andrew Presbyterian Church convened at 7 pm in Fellowship Hall. Pastor Bob opened the meeting with prayer.

Session **approved** the removal from the rolls of Jennifer Cable, Gary Christiansen, Shannon Christiansen, Renee Choe-Winter, Christy Logan, James Moody, Heather Bozek, Clint Brass, Paul Bronkhorst, Katherine Knabe, Tammy Cummings, Betty Gallagher, Nick Knight and Aaron Nelson. Session **approved** to move to inactive rolls Dave Brown, Cindy Brown, Tom Brown, and Kathy Brown.

After hearing her faith journey, Session **approved** Ruth Dane as elder and set installation for April 11 at 11am.

Session **approved** Stephen Ministry Program request for \$2,000 for 2010 for leadership training.

Marilyn Holland's small group will host a Senior Fellowship Luncheon on April 20.

After much discussion, a motion was made to publish the Alban Institute Consultant Report document to the whole congregation. This was **approved**. The document will go out as a

web site with the ability to blog. Copies will also be available at the church. Toni encouraged everyone to access on-line *Faith Communities Today: Facts on Growth*, which the Alban report references. A motion was **approved** to invite Susan Nienaber for a second visit to train facilitators and to assist us in working on church identity issues.

The Personnel Team presented a revised Sabbatical Leave Policy that clarifies some issues. This was **approved**.

This Consent Agenda Item brought by MOS **was not approved**: \$2400 to be allocated to Campus Ministry for \$600/semester stipends for 2 Peer Ministers, with \$1200 to be provided now and \$1200 to be provided in August 2010.

Continuing past policy, Session decided not to send a church representative to attend University Heights Council Meetings. Session affirmed that any questions University Heights Council may have certainly can be made in writing to the Session.

James Hemsley reported that the Pastor Nominating Committee spoke with the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry. This is about a concern the PNC has with the Presbytery's process of vetting senior pastor candidates. The COM responded that they affirm the Presbytery's process. Given new events that have arisen, the Session asked the PNC to approach the Committee on Ministry again with this concern.

Session adjourned at 11:00 p.m. with prayer by Pastor Bob.

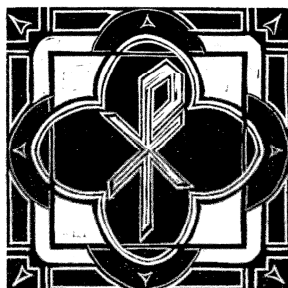
Taylor, Scott Diekema, Walter Robles, and Thomas Sparks.

# Stewardship

The Presbyterian Church (USA) has designated the first Sunday in May as *Wills Emphasis Sunday*. The intent is two-fold. First, that all adults need a written will. Second, that creating the will is an opportunity to leave a financial legacy to the church through a bequest in the will.

This is a very personal decision. In my hometown church in DeWitt, Iowa, an elderly person who had been a longstanding member of the First Congregational United Church of Church – a seemingly quiet and unassuming person – left her estate to that church. Clearly the church meant a great deal to her. With those funds and others from the membership, the old “split foyer” church (and the even older building a block away that housed the Sunday school classes) were sold and replaced by a new one-level church with rooms for Sunday

school. That was nearly 20 years ago and costs have risen substantially since that time. So this true story is not likely to be our reality. But it serves as an example of what can be done. She would be pleased to know that on Sunday mornings it remains an active place, with new young families and grandparents alike, all together in one building on one floor.

A bequest need not be so grand to be treasured and remembered. It's not so much the amount as the intent. It's our memories of the person. Also, practically speaking, it's using the funds as intended by the deceased. Also, a bequest under will is a way to grow the 'givers hearts' of all of us that survive and remember the person and find inspiration in the example. If any of you have ever thought about a bequest, there has to be a very personal reason. You got to that place through your life's experi-

ence. Can such an act give meaning to you and your family? Give you some peace? Promote healing? Bring satisfaction? Or joy?

What a lost opportunity if we don't talk about this. As personal as this is, we, along with our pastors, offer ourselves as people that you can visit with. Anyone contemplating this has a life story to share, and we would be grateful for the opportunity to listen to that story. Thank you.

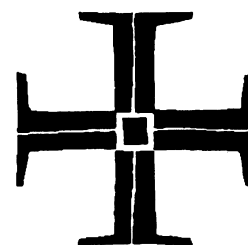
