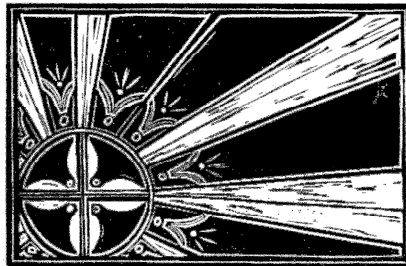

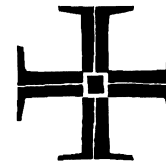
Announcements

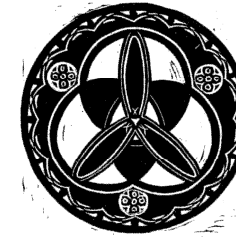
